




#### Q3 How long have you lived in this community?







## Q4 Some people reside in places outside the City of Harrisonville for part of the year. Which of the following describes how you reside in our city? (CHECK ONLY ONE)





### Q5 Thinking about your retirement years when you do not work, how likely is it that you will move to a different home within the City of Harrisonville?





## Q6 Thinking about your retirement years when you do not work, how likely is it that you will move to a different home outside of the City of Harrisonville?








## Q9 Do you own or rent your primary home – or do you have some other type of living arrangement, such as living in the home of a family member of friend?


#### Q10 What type of home is your primary home?







### Q11 How important is it for you to be able to live independently in your own home as you age?








## Q16 How important do you think it is to have the following in your community? (Choices: Extremely Important, Very Important, Somewhat Important, Not Very Important, Not At All Important)





## Q18 How often do you engage in some form of physical exercise (such as walking, running, biking, swimming, sports, strength training, yoga, stretching)?


















#### Q27 How do you keep informed of city news? (check all that apply)

### Q28 Are you female or male?




### Q29 What is your age as of your last birthday? \_\_\_\_ (Age in Years)

#### Q30 What is your current marital status?




### Q31 Besides yourself, do you have any of the following people living in your household? (Choices: Yes, No)






#### Q34 What is the highest level of education you have completed?




