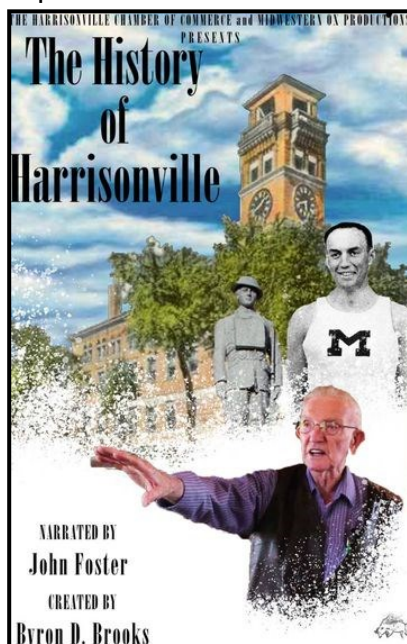

We want to make sure you are prepared for the many types of natural disasters possible here in the Heartland. Taking appropriate shelter is critical in times of disaster. And being aware of available resources could save your life. Current severe-weather shelters in Harrisonville include: **The Vault, located at 100 E Pearl Street & Antioch Southern Baptist Church, located at 2601 E Mechanic Street.**

NOTE: These facilities will only be activated in specific situations. An announcement will be made on the City’s social media pages when the shelters are open. Please do not wait until severe weather is happening to have a plan. Always stay weather aware. Know the difference between a Watch and a Warning, and know what to do when one is issued. Always have more than one way to receive severe weather information.
