<u>Fireworks Guidelines</u>—Most people would agree that fireworks are one of the best things about the Fourth of July. In Harrisonville, fireworks may be



purchased from a licensed vendor from June 20 through July 5. All vendors are required to have a City-issued business license. Most

fireworks may be enjoyed within the city limits on July 1-2, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m., as well as from 7 a.m. until midnight on July 3-4.

As a reminder, lit fireworks may not be thrown from a moving vehicle nor can bottle rockets be shot in the city. Remember, all fireworks exhibitions require both a permit and the payment of a fee.
