As we enter spring, the City will once again offer options for safely and responsibly disposing of unwanted items.

This year's City-Wide Clean Up will be held on two Saturdays, instead of the standard Friday/Saturday event. The City once again be using the GFL/WCA

facility, located at 22820 MO-291, as the host for the event. Gates will be open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Residents will unload their own



vehicles, with the assistance of City and GFL staff. This event is only available for those who live within the City limits. To participate, residents will need to provide proof of residency within the City limits of Harrisonville. GFL would also like to remind residents that they will pick up one bulky item per month, for free. ### NEW Community Improvement Grant Program —

As spring rolls around, don't forget about the new Community Improvement Grant program! The new program awards grants as reimbursements for construction costs for exterior improvements to existing houses. Improvements can include: Roof

repair/replacement, New paint or siding, New windows,

Foundation work, etc. Based on the type of project, a building permit may be required. Permit fees are waived for grant projects requiring permits.



If awarded, grants will reimburse 25-percent of the total project cost, up to a maximum \$2,500.

To participate in the program, the home needs to be owner-occupied and must have an appraised full market value no more than \$140,000 for the primary building (not including land).
