MO-7 Hwy at I-49 Bridge Replacement — The Missouri Department of Transportation has begun work to replace the MO Route 7 bridge over Interstate 49 and re-configure the interchange.

The bridge structure has reached the end of its service life and needs to be replaced.

We want to remind you that detailed information about any closures and detours will be posted on our website —www.harrisonville.com throughout the length of the project.

The interchange will be re-configured to a (split) Diverging Diamond Interchange to better accommodate existing and future traffic demands. The project is expected to be completed during the summer of 2024.
