Spring City-Wide Clean Up events — As we enter spring, the City will once again offer options for safely and responsibly disposing of unwanted items.

BRUSH DROP OFF — The spring City-Wide Brush Drop Off will be held from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on April 5 & 6.

To access the drop off site, residents should drive to City Park at Bradley Avenue and Ash Street and follow event signs. Crews will be available to help unload trailers. Crews ask that all limbs be less than 10 inches in diameter and want to remind residents that no yard waste will be accepted.



The event is only for those living inside City limits. Contractors will not be allowed to use the service. Mulch and compost will **NOT** be available.

TRASH ITEMS — This year's City-Wide Clean Up will be held on two Saturdays, May 11, and May 18. The City once again will be using the GFL/WCA facility, located at 22820 MO-291, as the host for the event. Gates will



be open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Residents will unload their own vehicles, with the assistance of City staff. This event is only available for those who live

within the City limits. To participate, residents will need to provide proof of residency within the City limits of Harrisonville. GFL would also like to remind residents that they will pick up one bulky item per month, for **FREE**. Lead Service Line Survey — The City of Harrisonville's Combined Water & Sanitary Sewer Department needs your help to identify the material of the water service line coming into your home. Following guidance from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, all water systems - such as the City of Harrisonville - must complete and submit to the state a lead service line inventory by October of 2024. To accomplish this, we are seeking

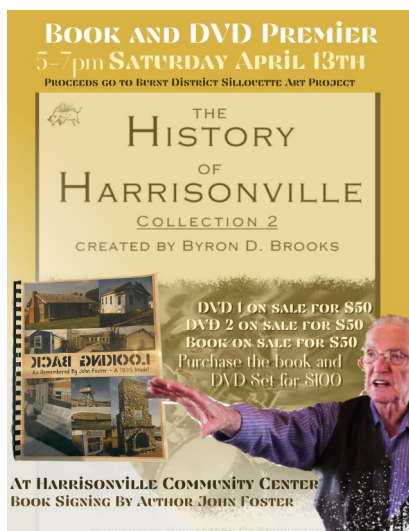


assistance from our customers to complete a required inventory of water service line materials. Customers who submit this form with complete information by May 31, 2024, are eligible to receive **\$20 off** of a future utility bill. It is important that residents check their water service line because all potential sources of lead in plumbing should be removed when possible.

We are committed to distributing safe, reliable and affordable drinking water to our community. We continue to deliver on this commitment by completing a comprehensive inventory of the materials that make up our community's drinking water service lines – the pipes that bring water into your home from the water main. A letter to residents that explains the situation in more detail, is **attached to this newsletter**.
