North Park Update — We wanted to share an update on the exciting improvements that are coming to North Park and the surrounding area. As Harrisonville continues to strive for growth and innovation, the extension of Royal Street from MO-291 Highway to Jefferson Parkway is one of the cornerstones of momentum for the community. Through a strategic partnership between the City and the MO-291/71 Transportation Development District (TDD), this innovative project provides access to untapped development potential on the north end of town and will be a focal point for both commercial developments, such as



restaurants, retail stores and hotels, and for residential developments that serve a wide range of demographics. This \$24 million project will include one mile of three-lane road; connecting Route 291 with Jefferson Pkwy.; curbed/enclosed drainage; lighting; water mains and buried electrical main; tournament-style athletic fields; rodeo arena and livestock show barn; and a storm water retention pond with nearly a mile of sidewalk and walking paths. “Expanding Royal Street will open up 200 acres of development opportunities, from retail to residential expansion,” City Administrator Ratliff said. “The opportunity for the ball fields to draw tournaments creates a regional draw that brings thousands of competitors and their families to town every weekend – a huge win for our community!” Construction is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2024, with a ribbon cutting for the roads by Oct. 1, 2025, and the parks sports amenities will open by March 1, 2026.

Helping You Tackle Home-Improvement Projects —

As spring rolls around, don't forget about the City's **Community Improvement Grant program**! The program awards grants as reimbursements for construction costs for exterior improvements to existing houses. Improvements can include: Roof repair/replacement, New paint or siding, New windows, Foundation work, etc. Based on the type of project, a building permit may be required. Permit fees are waived for grant projects requiring permits. If awarded, grants will reimburse 25-percent of the total project cost, up to a maximum \$2,500.



To participate in the program, the home needs to be owner-occupied and must have an appraised full market value no more than \$140,000 for the primary building (not including land).

Lead Service Line Survey Deadline —

The City of Harrisonville's Combined Water & Sanitary Sewer Department needs your help to identify the material of the water service line coming into your home.

To accomplish this, we are seeking assistance from our customers to complete a required survey of water service line materials.

Customers who submit the survey with complete information by **May 31, 2024**, are eligible to receive \$20 off of a future utility bill. It is important
