Municipal Waste Services Starts Jan. 1 — Our new contract with Municipal Waste Services starts January 1. New carts will be delivered later this month, **but do not use them until after January 1. The current hauler will not pick up trash in the new carts.** For the time being, most residents can expect their normal collection day to remain the same as it is now, except on weeks when a holiday occurs. During that time, collection will be delayed one day. This includes Monday, January 1. Trash collection will be delayed one day during the first week because of the New Year holiday. Get Your Pets Ready for 2018— Everybody needs a break after the holidays and the Harrisonville Animal Shelter is here to help. They will be holding a low-cost vaccination, microchip and licensing clinic on Saturday, January 6, 10 a.m.—2 p.m. at North Park Activity Center. Dog and cat owners can get the required vaccinations for their pets against deadly rabies plus parvo/distemper for dogs and FRCPV for pets. They can also get their animals microchipped if they wish and purchase city tags all at one simple easy stop. City ordinances require that each animal (dogs and cats) be vaccinated for rabies. Dogs must also be vaccinated for distemper. If your pet is already vaccinated you can still have the microchip inserted or purchase a city tag. The tags are \$5 for each sterilized pet and \$8 for each non-sterilized pet. Please bring proof of current vaccinations (i.e. rabies and distemper for dogs, and rabies for cats) and sterilization from your vet.

EMS Class — Do you have what it takes to become an Emergency Medical Technician? If you believe you have the skill and the courage to care for injured people under many types of adverse conditions, you should check out the Basic EMT Course which will be offered by the Emergency Services Department. The course starts Thursday, January 11 and will meet on Mondays and Thursdays, 6-10 p.m. Classes will cover the roles and responsibilities of an EMT, helping students develop skills in diagnosis and treatment and preparing them to take the National Institute for Emergency Medical Training (NIEMT) Practical Exam and the National Registry for Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) Written Exam. Utility Payment Deadlines — Here are the final deadlines for payment of past due accounts.

December..... Wednesday, Dec. 27, **prior to 8 a.m.**

January..... Thursday, Jan. 25, **prior to 5 p.m.**

After the deadline, any past due account will be charged the \$50 administrative fee, additional deposit fees as applicable, and scheduled for disconnection on the next business day. If you have questions, please call City Hall, 380-8900.

The Level Pay program is available to any City of Harrisonville residential electric utility customer with a good payment history and at least 12 consecutive months of utility billing history at the current service address. You may apply in person at City Hall during regular business hours.
