Lake Harrisonville Boat Ramp — The boat ramp at Lake Harrisonville has been re-opened. For 2018, we are requiring that people get a no-cost boat permit to use your boat on the lake. Stop by City Hall to get yours. (If you have already purchased a 2018 boat permit, we will refund the fee.) You will also need a city fishing permit, which costs \$2 for those living in Harrisonville and \$5 for Cass County residents.

Electric Utility Recognized with RP3 Designation — We are proud to announce that the Harrisonville electric department is one of eight Missouri Public Utility Alliance members to earn a 2018 Reliable Public Power Provider designation from the American Public Power Association for providing reliable and safe electric service. Only 118 of the nation's more than 2,000 public power utilities earned this honor. The designation lasts for three years and recognizes public power utilities that have demonstrated their proficiency in four key disciplines: reliability, safety, workforce development, and system improvement.

purchased from a licensed vendor from June 20 through July 5. All vendors are required to have a city-issued business license. Most types of fireworks may be enjoyed within the city limits on July 1 and 2 between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m., as well as from 7 a.m. until midnight on July 3 and 4. However, bottle rockets are strictly prohibited. In addition, lit fireworks may not be thrown from a moving vehicle. Remember, all fireworks exhibitions require both a permit and the payment of a fee. For questions on fireworks, please call the Community Development Department, 380-8958.

The Farmers Market on the Square is open every Saturday, 8—noon. The Cass County Farmers Market is located at the Family Center parking lot on Cantrell Road and is also open Saturdays, 8—noon.
