New emergency-communication tool available to residents

— The City of Harrisonville has partnered with Nixle, to implement its Community Notification System to alert residents in real-time of emergency situations and vital community information.

There are three simple ways to register:

1. Text your ZIPCODE (64701) to 888-777 from your mobile phone.
2. Visit www.nixle.com.
3. Use the widget at the bottom of the www.harrisonville.com home page.



The service is secure, reliable and easy to use.

All Alerts will be targeted geographically, allowing residents to receive localized, relevant alerts from the City about severe-weather information, safety hazards, security threats, traffic advisories and more. Nixle Alerts can be received via Text, Email, Web, Social Media and the Nixle Mobile App.

Yard Waste Pickup Begins April 1 — Beginning April 1, Municipal Waste Services will begin its weekly yard waste pickup. Yard Waste is a separate category of refuse and includes grass clippings, fallen leaves, pulled weeds or vines, garden refuse, small branch trimmings, and other small plant debris. Please place these items in biodegradable, paper bags or in a separate container that is plainly marked Yard Waste or “YW”. Tree trimmings must be cut in lengths no longer than four feet and securely tied in bundles weighing no more than 50 lbs. each. Up to 10 bags of yard waste will be accepted from residential customers each week, until October 31. Set yard waste out on your regular collection day. It will be collected on the same day as household trash, but not necessarily by the same truck or at the same time. **(Rock, dirt & concrete won't be collected.)**

Board of Aldermen alter meeting start time — During their March 2 meeting, the Board of Aldermen voted to change the start times of their bi-monthly meetings to 6 p.m. Currently, Board meetings are held on the first and third Monday’s of each month and begin at 7 p.m. The new start time will go into effect on Monday, March 16. As part of the vote, Board of Aldermen Work Sessions will now begin immediately following the regular Board meeting.

Utility Deadlines — The City of Harrisonville would like to make residents aware of the final deadlines for payment of past due March and April accounts.
