**City facilities reopening in phases** – City facilities began reopening on May 11. While businesses in Harrisonville were able to reopen on May 4, City facilities remained closed until the 11th, as staff worked to ensure all departments have the proper safeguards in place for limiting the spread of COVID-19 in our community during the reopening process. Here is a step-by-step look at the reopening procedures for City facilities.

● Beginning May 11, customers are able to conduct essential business - that is more efficient when done in person (setting up utilities, making deposits, payment issues, etc.) - inside the lobby of City Hall, **by appointment only**. Call (816) 380-8900 to set up an appointment. All other business will be conducted online or via phone. During this time, guests will only have access to the lobby and social-distancing guidelines will be strictly observed. Those conducting business inside City Hall will be required to leave their name and phone number for contact-tracing purposes, if a case is reported in connection with the facility.

● Beginning May 26, the lobby at City Hall will be open to visitors, without an appointment. The number of people allowed in the lobby will be limited and guests will have to remain in the lobby. Information will continue to be recorded for contact tracing purposes.

● During this time, the lobby of the Harrisonville Police Department will remain open to the public, but social-distancing guidelines will be strictly observed.

● Beginning May 11, the Harrisonville Emergency Services lobby will reopen for essential business only. For information about the Community Center, please see the back of this newsletter.

**Farmers Markets starting soon** – The Harrisonville Farmers Market on the Historic Harrisonville Square hopes to get underway soon. The Annual Vendors Meeting has been rescheduled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The meeting was originally scheduled for late April but will now be held on May 21, at 6 p.m., at 106 S Independence Street. Organizers have not set an official opening date for the market, at this time. The Cass County Farmers Market at Mill Walk Mall plans to open on June 6. Hours for both markets are Saturdays from 8 a.m. until noon. The Harrisonville market runs through the month of September and during the 2020 Log Cabin Festival! The Cass County market will remain open through October.

**City-Wide Clean Up events in June** – To maintain both the COVID-19 social-distancing requirements and our commitment to the health & safety of our community, the 2020 Spring City-Wide Clean Up has been rescheduled. The event, was originally scheduled for May 15-16, but will now tentatively be held on June 19-20. Please understand that the new date will depend on the state of the COVID-19 pandemic, in our community, at that time.



This year's event will be held at a **new location**. Harrisonville residents will be able to bring items to the Streets Department facility, located at 1403 S Independence Street, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on each day and drop them off for FREE. The event is limited to those living within the City limits. Residents are required to provide proof of residency. EXAMPLE: A Harrisonville utility-billing statement.

**REMINDER:** Municipal Waste Services will pick up one bulky item per month, for free. To have an item picked up, call (816) 406-9700 to schedule the pick-up.

**HHW** – In June the City will also host the annual Household Hazardous Waste event. From 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday, June 13, at the Streets Department facility, residents can drop off paint, batteries, oil, gas, lawn and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, and household cleaners. Proof of residency is required!

The Harrisonville Community Center will be following the Missouri “Show-Me Strong Recovery” guidelines set out by Missouri Governor Mike Parson and agreed upon by the Cass County Health Department.

Signs will be posted at the Community Center entrance and throughout the Center, reminding patrons to maintain 6-foot social-distancing regulations and to wash their hands often. Community Center staff will vigilantly disinfect all areas during open hours and before each day's use.

Inside the facility, fitness machines have been placed 6-feet apart to maintain social distancing. Guests are asked to wipe down any equipment before and after each use and to please sneeze and cough into a tissue or elbow.

**The Day Camp program has also opened, following Center for Disease Control guidelines.**

**The Tot Watch program will remain closed until June 1.**

**The Youth Sports programs have been delayed until June 1, along with the South Metro teams in this league.**

**The Playgrounds, outdoor Basketball Court and Skate Park will remain closed until May 31, following state guidelines.**

**The Outdoor Pool in City Park will not open during the 2020 season.**
